

All visits require an appointment. We are now allowing a longer visit time (45 minutes) as this is allowable under our guidelines. We hesitated to do this as it will lower the total number of visits we can have due to our space limitations. Please contact Sheri at 906-204-1014 to set up an appointment. Please give a 24-hour notice for scheduling. PLEASE be on time as the visits are tightly scheduled and being late disrupts the schedule. If you arrive early please be patient as we may ask you to wait outside until the scheduled time of your visit,

For indoor visits, COVID testing is advised if not vaccinated. If you are being tested, call the main desk (if you have a cell phone) when you arrive. You may park in the loop by the main door, and someone will come out to your car and perform the COVID test. You can then park and we will notify you when your test result is available. We are leaving the rows closest to the door reserved for visitor's parking for your convenience.

Rules for visits:

1. ALL Visitor(s) must have their temperature taken and complete a symptom questionnaire prior to visit. Vaccination status and COVID contract will be signed.
2. There is a 45-minute time limit. Visits are preferred Monday thru Friday. Weekend visits require prior notice, but please schedule by the Friday before.
3. Two visitors maximum are allowed at a time indoor visits, up to 4 for outside visits.
4. A paper surgical mask (facility provided) MUST be worn in and out of the Facility. Appropriate social distance will be maintained unless you provide proof of being fully vaccinated and the resident you are visiting is fully vaccinated. Masks must be worn at all times if you are not vaccinated or chose not to disclose your vaccination status. Vaccinated visitors can remove their mask once in the private visiting area.
5. The guidelines do not allow for inside visitation for residents in quarantine except for end-of-life visits.

In addition to the visits outlined above, we encourage you to visit your loved ones by arranging FaceTime, telephone, or Window visits (but times must be arranged so we have a phone for the resident as the window MUST remain closed) by setting up appointments with the Activities department.

If you are not feeling well or have COVID symptoms, please do not come to the facility and instead visit by one of the remote means mentioned above.

We continue to closely monitor residents for symptoms. Staff also are being screened before their shift for symptoms.

We also strongly encourage everyone to get the vaccine as soon as you can. It is very effective at controlling the spread of the deadly COVID-19 virus.
