Welcome to the January Newsletter From the Administrator

Happy New Year!

There has been no change in our visitation guidelines from last month. Visits no longer need to be scheduled. Every visitor needs to be screened & use our main entrance (even the 500/600 wings). For this reason, we ask that you visit between the hours of 10am-5pm if at all possible, as our front door will be staffed during those hours. If you are not able to come during those

hours, you will need to ring the doorbell for entry. There may be some delay in staff availability to answer the door, as resident care may be taking place. We ask that you be patient with staff who are taking on extra duties to facilitate your visit. Visits will typically be in the resident room as visitors CAN NOT walk or wander throughout the facility. They must go to the designated visit space and remain there until the end of the visit. Physical distancing between the visitor, resident and resident's roommate is required. We ask for prior notice if more than 3 visitors will be coming at one time, so that we can provide an alternative space to accommodate social distancing. No large parties are allowed at this time. Hand hygiene must be performed at the front door. Masks and eye protection must be worn the ENTIRE visit, so meal times are not a good time to visit. Visitors are not allowed to eat/drink with residents.

Visitors who are unable to adhere to the guidelines, including distancing and personal protective equipment, will be asked to leave and not permitted to visit. Covid-19 is still prevalent in our community, especially the very contagious Omicron variant, and visits increase the risk to both the resident and the visitor. If you have experienced any exposure to a Covid positive person in the last 14 days, are experiencing any Covid like symptoms (fever, body aches, respiratory concerns, loss of taste or smell), you should not enter the building.

Vaccines have been a vital part of protection for our residents and we encourage visitors to consider getting them if they haven't already done so. Visitors can be tested at the main entrance if they choose. We still request advance notice for leaves of absence, as this allows us to have the resident & medications prepared for you.
